Epistemology of Perception: Wilfrid Sellars and the Myth of the Given Dr. Alfredo Vernazzani

Description:

Wilfrid Sellars (1912 – 1989) stands out as one of the most important philosophers of the 20th century. In his work, he sought to formulate a «scientifically oriented, naturalistic realism which would 'save the appearances'» ("Autobiographical Reflections" 1973). Philosophers like John McDowell, Robert Brandom, Jay Rosenberg, Danielle Macbeth, Paul and Patricia S. Churchland, Richard Rorty, and many others have been influenced by his work. Among his papers, the most influential one has been his "Empiricism and the Philosophy of Mind" (EPM) (1956) where Sellars attacked the 'Myth of the Given', touching on issues such as the nature of perceptual experience, epistemology of perception, and the philosophy of language.

In this seminar, we will read, comment, and contextualize EPM.
